FROM EQUALITY TO EQUITY: NAVIGATING POWER & PRIVILEGE AS REFEREES

As part of the Super Clinic Weekend, Ardavan Eizadriard & Nadine Crowley led an interactive workshop that emphasized the difference between equality and equity as part of becoming critically conscious and unlearning social norms that can be oppressive.

It was a powerful session that also provided an opportunity to for attendees to share negative experiences they have faced as referees and strategies on how we can make officiating more inclusive. <u>2020 FIBA OBRI -</u> <u>Official Interpretation (v.3.0)</u>

 The changes are again marked in yellow highlighting and are very minor. Effectively language like "to be substituted" is introduced and the location of a throw-in after a foul or violation – when the basket is cancelled – is corrected in a few cases. The odd new case involving once a year situation has been added.

 The changes are exceptionally minor, from a Canadian perspective, only impacting Appendix D, Classification of Teams. New language in yellow highlighting starting on Page 83.
