

CBOC Launches NOCP Level 1 Training

CBOC is pleased to announce the launch of National Officials Certification Program (NOCP) training. In November, we will be offering the first of two online sessions of NOCP Level 1 training for referees across the country, referees who are

early in their officiating journey and others wishing to progress beyond local youth leagues and school-based programs. For details, please see the flyer on **page 2.**

As part of the Canadian Basketball Referee Development Pathway, CBOC is rolling out a comprehensive National Officials Certification Program (NOCP) from a Community Referee (Level 1), through various stages all the way to a National Referee (Level 4). At each level, officials will go through education opportunities to develop rules knowledge and practical skills to referee at the relevant level of competition. Progress through the levels and phases is achieved through a mixture of online training, an on-court practical session, as well as assessment/evaluation.

We encourage all existing Level 1 officials and those just starting out on their officiating journey to register for one of these first two training sessions. As the full national program is being rolled-out, existing NOCP Level 1 officials will be required to complete the full Level 1 program before advancing to Level 2. This on-line training is a pre-requisite for advancing to the next level. Based on the demand for this training, more NOCP 1 online training sessions will be scheduled in the upcoming months.

Online registration will be completed through your Game Plan account, with the NOCP Level 1 training found under the "Workshops" tab.

WHY

IS IT IMPORTANT TO PROGRESS THROUGH THE OFFICIALS PATHWAY?

The Canadian Basketball Referee Development Program is a comprehensive development pathway for referees from local community league games to being a FIBA referee at international events.

This programme has been developed by the Canadian Basketball Officials Commission (CBOC) in partnership with Canada Basketball and the Provincial Basketball Officials Associations. It is based on the Canada Basketball Long Term Development Plan, and aligns the referee framework with player and coach frameworks, competitions and tournaments.

Each developmental level aims to equip referees with the knowledge, rules and practical skills to referee at the relevant level of competition. Progress through the levels and phases is achieved through a mixture of theory, training and practical assessment. COMPETITIVE REFEREE

WHO

SHOULD TAKE THE NOCP LEVEL TRAINING?

The NOCP Level 1 training is for referees early in their officiating journey who are mainly refereeing school based or local youth leagues. It is for those referees who have completed the Recreational Referee course and would like to progress to officiating beyond a junior community level.

This training aims to equip participants with an understanding of the rules and the role of a referee in community level games. It is a prerequisite to advance through NOCP Levels 2 to 5.

At the completion of this training, participants will be able to:

- Recognize the professional expectations of a referee and understand the basic skills needed to maintain game control.
- Identify accurate positioning, court coverage and the roles of Trail and Lead officials in 2 person officiating mechanics, while using correct FIBA signals.
- Understand the key technical skills and mechanics for specific tasks and procedures to allow the game to be conducted efficiently, correctly and under control.
- Effectively express decisions and communicate with players, coaches, table officials and partners, as well as dealing with conflict situations.
- Gain basic knowledge about the game of basketball and its rules.
